

Manchester City of Literature Information Pack

Producer - International Artist Exchange Programme November 2024 - July 2025

Manchester City of Literature will shortly be announcing a new 9-month artist exchange with China. Collaborations between six artists - poets, illustrators and playwrights - will create new multilingual work to be published and exhibited in both cities in summer 2025 including at the Festival of Libraries in Manchester in June 2025. All creative collaborations plus a parallel schools engagement programme respond to ecological themes. A Creative Producer will coordinate all elements of the project and create a legacy tool-kit to guide future collaborations. This project will **Creative** be the starting point for a long-time partnership between the two cities managed by the UNESCO offices and HEI partners.

The freelance Creative Producer will work with teams in both Manchester and China and with the artists to work creatively, strategically and operationally to bring the aims and ambitions of the project to life.

Key Deliverables:

- Following a commissioning meeting for all partners set a detailed delivery plan including timeline, milestones, deliverables and responsibilities (based on an existing outline)
- Oversee the creation of briefs and any open calls for artists in each city's artistic community.
- Oversee the creation of packs for schools produced and liaise with the Manchester City of Literature team on distribution
- Work with the steering group to confirm and manage collaborative pairings between artists.
- Create an agreed online meeting schedule for artists between December and February 2025
- Arrange specialist briefings for the artists on cross-cultural working
- Coordinate the travel and visits of the UK artists to China in March 2025
- Work with the steering group to give feedback to artists on the first drafts of their work
- Work with the Manchester City of Literature team to ensure plans for promotion of the exhibition and publication events in both cities are in place.
- Oversee the work of the team working on creating the Poetry and Illustration publication
- Put in place plans to host the Chinese artists when they visit the UK for Festival of Libraries 2025
- Liaise with the Creative Producer for Festival of Libraries on the delivery of script-in-hand readings of the play, an exhibition of work by young people and the launch of the illustrated poetry publication
- Support the Evaluation of the project through interviews with partners and artists
- Create a legacy tool-kit for the project on UK-China artistic collaboration
- Work with the Manchester City of Literature team on the completion of final reporting to the project funder.

The Contractor shall:

- Deliver a programme that meets objectives around diversity, inclusion and accessibility as well as creative goals and engagement targets.
- Maintain excellent relationships with Manchester City of Literature's partnership network of

- publishers, festivals, writing agencies, libraries, cultural organisations, the education sector and tourism partners.
- Maintain clear and effective filing and administration for the project.
- Monitor and manage the project budget to ensure it meets financial targets and remains within budget, in collaboration with the Executive Director and the finance team.
- To ensure that all activity complies with the conditions of the project funder.

Other responsibilities as required to meet the needs of the project.

At all times, the Creative Producer must ensure the vision and values of Manchester City of Literature are embedded in all activities and communications.

As a UNESCO Creative City, Manchester City Of Literature is committed to building international relationships with other Creative Cities. Manchester City Of Literature believes that these relationships and sharing of practice create bridges of understanding between peoples. These bridges cross political, geographical, ethnic, cultural, religious and other divides. Manchester City Of Literature supports the right to freedom of opinion and expression. Where other countries may not demonstrate their support to this right, Manchester City Of Literature believes there is greater benefit to be gained from working in cooperation with Creative Cities to champion freedom of expression, share best practice and demonstrate the benefits that can be gained in cultural, economic and social terms from enabling such freedoms. Manchester City Of Literature believes that shutting the door to cooperation in this way could actually result in further cultural isolation and the reinforcement of oppressive norms. The exception would be where any official UK government sanctions are in place or Manchester City Of Literature receives direct advice from the UK government.
